1.	Application form for admission to BSMS / BAMS / BHMS Degree Courses 2022 - 2023 session under Management Quota Seats in IM & H Self – Financing Medical Colleges can be downloaded / accessed from the following official website: www.tnhealth.tn.gov.in . Candidates should submit their downloaded duly filled in Application form with all the required supporting documents along with the details of payment of Rs.1000/- (Rupees One Thousands only) towards the application cost i.e, with SBI collect transaction ID (Original receipt to be enclosed). The Procedure of online payment is mentioned in clause 26 of the Prospectus.
2.	The admissions in the State of Tamil Nadu are as per the provisions of the Government of Tamil Nadu and in compliance to the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) / Indian Medicine Central Council (Minimum Standards of Education in Indian Medicine) Amendment Regulations, 2018 and the National Commission for Homoeopathy (NCH) / the Homoeopathy (Degree course) Amendment Regulations, 2018 shall be solely based on marks obtained in the National Eligibility-Cum-Entrance Test (NEET (UG) – 2022) conducted by NTA.
3.	As per amended Regulations, the seat matrices for admission in the Self-Financing Institutions shall be fifteen per cent for the All India Quota and eighty five per cent for the States Quota for the academic year 2022 - 2023. Further Apportionment of seats between Government and Management of Self–Financing Minority and Non-Minority IM & H Colleges will be as per existing State policy and NCISM / NCH Regulations.
4.	Use one common application form for all courses, namely, a. Bachelor of Siddha Medicine & Surgery [B.S.M.S] b. Bachelor of Ayurveda Medicine & Surgery [B.A.M.S] c. Bachelor of Homoeopathy Medicine & Surgery [B.H.M.S]
5.	Before filling up the Application form, the candidates are advised to download the prospectus and read all the instructions carefully along with parents/guardians. Fill up the Application form legibly, neatly and correctly. The information will be processed by using computer. Any mistake committed by the candidate will prejudice one's selection.
6.	Filled in application form with all relevant documents prescribed may be delivered in person or by Registered post / Courier Service / Speed post before 5.30 P.M. on 21.10.2022to: The Secretary, Selection Committee, Directorate of Indian Medicine & Homoeopathy, Arignar Anna Government Hospital of Indian Medicine Campus, Arumbakkam, Chennai – 600 106.

7.	Self - Attested Photostat copies of the required documents alone should be sent. Original Certificates should not be enclosed. Incomplete applications and the applications received after the due date will be summarily rejected.
8.	The Selection Committee cannot be held responsible for the delayed receipt or loss in transit or on any other ground beyond the fixed date and time. Applications received after the last date and time will not be accepted irrespective of the date of booking.
9.	Request for extension of time for submission of application form along with all the required supporting documents called for, after the specified date and time will not be entertained.
10.	Application form of the candidates along with all the relevant documents received after the due date of submission of the application form or application form of the candidates received without required supporting documents / particulars will be summarily rejected.

1	ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA:- Candidate should be a citizen of India.
2	AGE LIMIT (As per Clause 5.1.2 of NEET UG 2022 Bulletin) Candidates should have completed the age of 17 years at the time of admission or should complete that age on or before 31 st December of 2022. and there is no upper age limit.
3	EDUCATIONAL QUALIFICATIONS: <p>(i) In compliance to the National Commission for Indian system of Medicine (NCISM)/CCIM, Minimum Standards of Education In Indian Medicine, Amendment Regulations, 2018 and the National Commission for Homoeopathy (NCH)/CCH Amendment Regulations, 2018 the eligibility for admission to BSMS / BAMS / BUMS / BHMS Degree courses for this academic year shall be based solely on marks obtained in the National Eligibility-Cum-Entrance Test (NEET UG-2022) conducted by NTA.</p> <p>(ii) In order to be eligible for admission to BSMS / BAMS / BHMS Degree courses for this academic year, it shall be necessary for a candidate to obtain minimum of marks at 50th Percentile in NEETUG-2022. However in respect of candidates belonging to BC /BC(M) / MBC / DC / SC / SCA/ ST, the minimum marks shall be at 40th Percentile in NEETUG-2022. In respect of candidates with Persons with Benchmark disabilities alone the minimum marks shall be at 45th Percentile for General Category candidates and 40th Percentile for BC /BC(M) / MBC / DC / SC / SCA/ ST candidates in NEET UG-2022.</p> <p>(iii) a. Further, to be eligible for admission to BSMS / BAMS / BUMS / BHMS Degree courses, Candidates must have passed in all the subjects of the qualifying examination of the Higher Secondary Certificate Examination (Academic) conducted by the Tamil Nadu State Board or any other equivalent Board with the subjects of Physics, Chemistry, Biology / Botany and Zoology and English individually and must have obtained minimum of fifty percent of marks taken together in Physics, Chemistry, Biology / Botany and Zoology at the aforesaid qualifying examination in the case of general category and forty percent of marks in the case of ST / SCA / SC / MBC / DC / BCM and BC category. In respect of Candidates with Benchmark Disabilities the minimum qualifying marks in the said qualifying examination in Physics, Chemistry, Biology / Botany and Zoology shall be forty five percent in the case of general category and forty percent in the case of ST / SCA / SC / MBC / DC / BCM and BC candidates.</p> <p>b. If sufficient number of candidates in respective categories fail to secure minimum marks in NEET *UG) 2022, the Central Government in consultation with National Council for Indian System of Medicine and National Council for Homoeopathy under its discretion may lower the minimum marks required for admission to UG Courses for candidates belonging to respective categories and marks so lowered by the Central Government shall be applicable for the academic year 2022-23 only. 	<p>separate application will be called for and admissions will be made as per merit and rule of reservation.</p> <p>(iv) Candidates qualified in the NEET (UG) - 2022 and who have passed the qualifying examinations from <i>National Institute of Open Schooling or State Open Schools or as private candidates</i> from recognized State Boards; or with Biology/Biotechnology as an additional subject shall be allowed but subject to the outcome of Special Leave Petitions/ Appeals filed by the Medical Council of India. (As per NEET (UG) 2022 Guidelines)</p> <p>Note: * <i>"The proviso in italics has been a subject matter of challenge before the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi, Hon'ble High Court of Allahabad, Lucknow Bench, and Hon'ble High Court of Madhya Pradesh at Jabalpur. The provisions of the regulations disqualifying recognized Open School Board candidates and the candidates who have studied Biology/Biotechnology as an Additional Subject has been struck down."</i></p> <p>(v) Language qualification for BSMS Course</p> <p>In addition to the required minimum percentile in the NEETUG-2022</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. The candidate should have studied in Tamil medium up to X or XII Standard, or 2. The candidate should have studied Tamil as a subject up to X or XII Standard, or 3. The candidate must be prepared to pursue the study of Tamil Language as a subject during the First professional course of B.S.M.S. course, to become eligible to take the other subjects examination of the BSMS Course. <p>NOTE:- Candidates who have passed any other equivalent examinations other than the Tamil Nadu state Board Examination and CBSE in India with same subjects as mentioned above in clause 3 (iv) should produce the eligibility certificate from The Tamil Nadu Dr. MGR Medical University before the counselling date or before attending the counselling.</p>
4	<p>ELIGIBILITY FOR MINORITY SEATS :</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. The candidates who are eligible to claim Linguistic Minority Seats reflecting their mother tongue (Telugu/Malayalam) should produce the Study Certificate issued by the Head of the Institution last studied – Annexure-VI (a) or a certificate issued by the competent revenue authority of the candidate's native jurisdiction – Annexure – VI (b). 2. The candidates who are eligible to claim Religious Minority seats (Christian)/ Linguistic Minority seats(Malayalam), which is a NOTIFIED MINORITY COMMUNITY AS PER Section 2 (c) of National Commission for Minorities Act, 1992 should produce the Study Certificate issued by the Head of the Institution last studied – Annexure -VI (a) or a certificate issued by the competent revenue authority of the candidate's native jurisdiction – Annexure – VI (b). The candidates submitting these Annexures in full form alone will be given preference in Minority Colleges as per their minority status.

5	<p>INELIGIBILITY CRITERIA :</p> <p>The following categories of candidates are NOT ELIGIBLE to apply for B.S.M.S. / B.A.M.S. / B.H.M.S. Courses.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a. Candidates who have passed H. Sc. in Vocational Stream <i>or</i> who have passed Pre-University Course in Tamil Nadu b. The selection and admission of candidates of other Universities / Boards will be provisional subject to recognition of the qualifying examination by the Tamil Nadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University under which the candidate gets admitted. In case, the recognition is not accorded for the admission of the candidate on any grounds, the provisional admission will not entitle the candidate for the continuance of the course and the admission will be cancelled. c. Candidates presently pursuing the B.S.M.S. / B.A.M.S. / B.H.M.S. / B.U.M.S. Courses are NOT

7	<p>DURATION OF THE BSMS / BAMS / BHMS COURSES:</p> <p>5 1/2 years of study including one year Compulsory Rotatory Resident Internship.</p>
8	<p>METHOD OF SELECTION AND ADMISSION:</p> <p>(i). The admission shall be made on the basis of National Eligibility-cum-Entrance Test NEET UG-2022 score and NEET Rank for B.S.M.S. / B.A.M.S. / B.H.M.S. Courses for the year 2022 - 2023 for the Seats under Management Quota in Self Financing IM & H Medical Colleges.</p> <p>(ii). Rank List of the eligible candidates shall be prepared on the basis of the marks obtained in NEET UG-2022 and candidates shall be admitted to the above courses from the said rank list only. Further Secretary, Selection Committee will publish the tentative rank list on the following official website : www.tnhealth.tn.gov.in</p>
9	<p>All selections and admissions for BSMS / BAMS / BHMS Courses are only provisional. The Selection and admission is liable to be cancelled at any time as and when the eligibility conditions are found to be defective or incorrect or of any suppression of facts deliberately or otherwise. The right of allotment to BSMS / BAMS / BHMS courses and Colleges is vested totally with the Selection Committee.</p>
10	<p>COUNSELLING (Single Window System):</p> <p>SELECTION COMMITTEE:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a. Selection Committee is the designated authority for counseling for all admissions to undergraduate courses in Siddha, Ayurveda, Homoeopathy and Unani medicine in all Government, Self Financing ASUH Institutions of Tamil Nadu. b. No authority or institution shall admit any candidate to the undergraduate course in contravention of the criteria or procedure as laid down by Selection Committee in respect of admissions and any candidate admitted in contravention of the said criteria or procedure shall be discharged. c. The authority or institution which grants admission to any student in contravention of the criteria or procedure shall be liable to face action in terms of provisions of the NCISM and NCH Amendment Regulation 2018.

Selection of candidates will be made based on NEET UG-2022 score and by following Single Window System during counselling. Counselling schedule will be available only on the official website: www.tnhealth.tn.gov.in

(i). Candidates should attend the counselling session as per the schedule and as per their rank as mentioned in the official website : www.tnhealth.tn.gov.in only.

(ii). One of the Parents or Guardian will be allowed to accompany the candidate to attend the counselling and they should make their own arrangements for attending the counselling session.
Also use of Mobile Phones will be strictly prohibited in the Counselling Hall.

(iii) Candidates will be called for counselling as per their rank and they may exercise their option as per their eligibility norms mentioned in the Prospectus.

(iv) **Option once exercised during counselling, will be final and cannot be changed.**

(v) **Candidates who fail to attend the First Phase counselling at the specified date and time will also be not permitted to attend the subsequent phases of counselling.** The candidates will forfeit their right to admission and their names will not be considered later. However he / she can authorize his / her parent on his / her behalf for that phase of counselling due to unavoidable circumstances and the parent's decision will be binding on the candidate. An Authorization letter given by candidate should be submitted by the parents along with the original documents of any one of the identification proof such as Voter ID, Driving Licence, Pan Card / Passport of both the parent and the candidate as mentioned in the Annexure VA and VB.

(vi) Rules as applicable for the Management Quota seats as per the prevalent NCISM/CCIM / NCH/ CCH rules and regulations, State Policy and the relevant rules of institutions applicable to the Self Financing Management Quota will apply.

(vii)(a). All Communications regarding Counselling will be displayed / available through the official website only and any change or modification and relevant information pertaining to this admission process will be made available immediately on the website www.tnhealth.tn.gov.in.

(b).The candidates are instructed to visit the website at least two times a day for updates from the date of issue of application till the end of admission process without fail. Selection Committee will not be responsible for consequences resulting due to non-diligent follow-up of notices, notification and publications appearing on the website regarding admission to B.S.M.S. / B.A.M.S. / B.H.M.S. Courses under Management Quota 2022 - 2023 session.

(viii) (a). Candidates can exercise their option for the course and the college of their own choice at the time of counselling, and allotment is subject to availability of seats.

(b). Individual request for transfer of College or change of course will not be entertained after allotment of seat is made during same phase of counselling. A candidate is eligible for Re-allotment only during subsequent phase of counselling based on rank and one should have joined the Self Financing college to which one was allotted under Management Quota during earlier phase of counselling.

(ix) (a)The vacancies arising after the first phase of counselling will be filled up from the waiting list through counselling.

(b) Also Counselling / Allotment for the seats newly created due to provision of seat matrix after the commencement of first phase counselling by the Tamil Nadu Dr.MGR Medical University or due to the orders / interim orders passed by the Honourable High Court Madras after the commencement of 1st phase counselling will be done **ONLY** during the 2nd phase counselling but within the cut off date for UG Courses admission as laid down by the regulatory bodies i.e., NCISM/CCIM & NCH/ CCH / Ministry of AYUSH.

	<p>(x) Mutual transfers will not be allowed under any circumstances.</p> <p>(xi) If a candidate opts out of / not willing to take any seat when seats are available in the particular course at the time of his / her counselling for Management Quota seat, then he/she will not be eligible for the same seat in that particular course at any point of time later for whatsoever reason.</p> <p>(xii) Candidates getting allotment, for any other reasons, at a later date after the counselling is over will be given a seat in the existing vacancies available in any one of the colleges Under Management Quota Seats irrespective of their merit of marks.</p> <p>(xiii) The candidate is eligible to opt for any of the courses viz. BSMS / BAMS / BHMS course under Management Quota in Self-financing colleges based on his/her eligibility. Likewise, he/she can opt to be waitlisted for a particular course under Management Quota.</p> <p>(xiv) Re-allotment for the vacancies arising due to non joining of the candidates will be done on merit basis subject to the availability of sufficient time before the cut off date as prescribed by the T.N. Dr. M.G.R. Medical University.</p> <p>(xv) Re-allotment will be available only for those who have joined the course within the stipulated time.</p> <p>(xvi) The candidates who have been allotted seats and failed to join the Course within the stipulated time are not eligible to attend the subsequent phases of Counselling for the academic year 2022 - 2023. This is applicable for all phases of the counseling.</p> <p>(xvii) Candidates getting allotment through court orders before the cut off date will be given a seat in the existing vacancies under Management Quota available at the time of counselling when he/she actually attends.</p> <p>(xviii) Counselling schedule will be made available on the website only.</p> <p>(xix) Due to unforeseen and unavoidable circumstances, if a candidate his/her parent / guardian could not attend the Counselling on the specified date and time, the candidate will be permitted to attend the counselling on the subsequent date in the same phase of counselling and he/she can only opt for the seats available at the time of counselling and cannot claim seat as per his /her rank. The candidate should submit Annexure V A and V B as authorization.</p> <p>xx. All vacancies due to not joining of candidates or New colleges in joining through court will be filled in Second phase. Candidates who fail to attend the First Phase counselling at the specified date and time will also be not permitted to attend the subsequent phases of counselling.</p> <p>xxi. Not joined / discontinued Candidates after receiving allotment, are not eligible for further phases of counselling.</p> <p>xxii. COVID Instructions :- The candidates and their parents are instructed to follow the standard preventive measures of COVID as per Government orders from time to time.</p> <p>xxiii. The Government orders issued and to be issued from time to time pertaining to any of the matters contained in this Prospectus should be read as part and parcel of this Prospectus and such terms and conditions in the Government order are deemed to have been incorporated in this Prospectus.</p>
11	TUITION FEES:

The Tuition Fees for BSMS, BAMS and BHMS courses under Management Quota in Self Financing Medical Colleges shall be collected as fixed by the Hon'ble Justice N.V. Balasubramanian Committee for the fixation of Fee for Self - Financing Professional Educational Institutions for the year 2022 - 2023.

Any modification in the Fee structure for the academic year 2022 - 2023 as fixed by the Fee Fixation Committee will be intimated at the time of counselling / Admission.

- (a) Detailed information regarding Tuition Fees, Special Fees, Caution Deposit, Scholarship, Fee Concession, Hostel Facilities, University Registration Fees, Curriculum Examination Fees, etc. can be obtained from the Head of the Institution in which the candidate joins.
- (b) The candidates who are selected at the time of counselling (Under Management Quota Seats in Self-Financing IM & H College) shall remit a **non refundable sum of Rs.25,000/-** (Rupees Twenty Five Thousand only) **as Cash**, compulsorily at the time of receipt of the allotment orders. After the conduct of **Registration Subcommittee meeting** by the Tamil Nadu Dr .M G R Medical University this amount will be transferred to the Self Financing Medical Colleges concerned to get adjusted against the Tuition Fees to be paid by the candidates. **If the candidate fails to join the course after getting allotment order** under Management Quota Seats **within the stipulated time he/she will forfeit this amount and the seat allotted.**
- (c) All the candidates attending IM & H UG courses counselling for Management Quota seats should remit a **non-refundable amount of Rs.1,000/-** (Rupees One Thousand only) **as Cash**, towards processing fee for Counselling before signing attendance register meant for participating in the counselling.
- (d) If any amount - remains due from the student as a result of revision of fees if any, it shall be payable by the student. An undertaking to pay any amount that may become due as and when the fee structure is revised should be given to the Head of Institution at the time of Admission.




